West Region Treaty 2 & 4 Health Services is an accredited First Nation organization that delivers a variety of Mandatory and Discretionary Health Care Services to the seven WRTC area First Nation Communities.

Under the supervision of the Jordan's Principle Services Coordinator and in accordance with WRT 2&4HS Mission, Values, Goals, Policies and Procedures, the Healing and Wellness Counselor will be responsible to provide short/long-term healing and wellness counselling services for membership of the WRTC communities.

As an active team member in the Program(s) assigned, the Healing and Wellness Counselor participates in the continuous quality improvement activities, including development, modification, and implementation of service and program goals, objectives, policies, procedures and standards. The Healing and Wellness Counselor uses service evaluation feedback to purposefully and continually strengthen services. The Healing and Wellness Counselor actively supports all program initiatives designed to strengthen services and program integrity.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Providing individual healing and wellness, parenting, family therapy and/or group therapy
- Provide services and supports to client(s) that promotes and supports mental health and wellness and cultural connection
- Provide/coordinate culturally based teachings, ceremonies and land-based activities
- Provide client care coordination. Assessment, planning, goal setting, referral, crisis intervention counseling, advocacy and on-going support services
- Client population: ages 3-17years
- Presenting issues include anxiety, depression, OCD, adjustment to separation/divorce, self-esteem, social difficulties, emotional regulation, life transitions, behavioral difficulties, cultural identification etc.
- Provides community-based services like workshops, presentations and team building activities focused on developing and enhancing skills and capacity of front-line workers.
